<b>(C) Professional Electives at least 20 credits</b>								
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students enrolled in this program must complete a minimum of 20 credits from any department as a minor field of study. If the credits earned from such a minor are less than 20, students must also take additional professional elective courses from the same department. Please refer to the department's list of required courses for minors.</li> <li>The field designated credits of this program do not include AP (Advanced Placement) courses for minors. Nevertheless, students must meet the requirement for AP courses. First-year students and sophomores must complete at least four professional elective courses from other departments.</li> <li>Students who have completed all the requirements will receive a diploma designating their field of study.</li> </ol>								

**(D) Electives, a minimum of 48 credits**

- 1 ‧ Students enrolled in this program must complete one interdisciplinary studies program. To enroll, students must apply to their desired programs in time and acquire approval of the proper authority according to respective program regulations. Students in their graduating semester must submit their application no later than two weeks before the course registration deadline.
- 2 ‧ Students enrolled in this program must complete one customized sustainable development program that is directly related to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The credits from this program's required courses must not exceed 6 in the customized sustainable development program. For more information, please refer to the CCU Customized Program Regulations.
- 3 ‧ Students enrolled in this program must complete 6 credits from off-campus intern projects. Students who fail to meet this requirement due to unusual circumstances may choose to complete the 6-credit Creative Innovation Startup Core Course instead after acquiring approval from the program committee.
- 4 ‧ Students enrolled in this program must complete one foreign language course or advanced English course. (a minimum of 2 credits)
- 5 ‧ Credits earned from General Education courses that exceed the minimum 28 requirement may be counted toward elective credits, but no more than 4 credits are allowed. Credits from withdrawn Teacher Education Program or credits that exceed the minimum TEP requirement can not be counted toward elective credits.
- 6 ‧ Credits not counted toward field designation credits may be counted toward elective credits.
- 7 ‧ Credits earned from military training (nursing), Physical Education courses may be counted toward elective credits in a degree program. However, only one credit is allowed for each course category per semester.

★As stated in the CCU Undergraduate Requirement Regulations, students are required to complete Service Learning: Community Service courses (2 credits). It is recommended that students meet the requirement before the end of their junior year, completing a minimum of 16 hours of community service or attending a minimum of two service learning lectures.
